Your Child's Teeth



A common question new parents have is "When should my child first see a dentist?" The short answer is "First visit by first birthday," More than 1 in 4 children

in the U. S. have cavities by the time they are 4 years old, sometimes as early as age 2.

What Causes Early Childhood Cavities?

Early Childhood Cavities is a serious disease that destroys your child's teeth. Several actions may cause it including: letting your baby fall asleep with a bottle, prolonged nursing, allowing your baby to fall asleep while nursing or even having your baby walk around with a bottle or sippy cup containing juice or milk can all cause cavities. Especially at night, make sure you brush your child's teeth before going to bed. Your child's healthy teeth and brilliant smile depend on you!

To prevent early childhood cavities, you have to

find out your child's risk of developing cavities, how to care for your child's mouth (including finger and thumb sucking), how to manage diet, hygiene and fluoride to prevent problems before they start.

You also want to bring your child back every 6 months for follow up visits.

What Is Orthodontics?

Orthodontics is the diagnosis, prevention and treatment of dental and facial irregularities. It offers correction for people with an irregular or "bad" bite. Orthodontic care involves the use of corrective appliances, usually braces. These corrective appliances can be used to: straighten teeth, correct bite irregularities, close unsightly gaps, bring teeth and lips into proper alignment, in young children, orthodontic treatment also may guide proper jaw growth and permanent tooth eruption.

Remember that your teeth should last a lifetime!
